In 1949, the University of Maryland Global Campus (UMGC) was the only pioneering institution to send seven professors to teach military students in postwar Germany. This deep-rooted tradition of serving the military in war and peace continues to this day.

This year, we are proud to celebrate our 75th year of delivering higher education overseas to U.S. military servicemembers and their families, exemplified through the incredible achievements of our students.

CELEBRATING 75 YEARS OVERSEAS

UMGC was founded in 1947 as the College of Special and Continuation Studies, a branch of the University of Maryland's College of Education, with locations in College Park and around the state. In 1949, UMGc became the first university to send faculty overseas to educate active-duty military personnel in Europe. What started off as a noble experiment, with seven professors in six cities in Germany, has turned into a globally-recognized, award-winning institution that includes graduates from all 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, and over 25 countries and territories worldwide.

UMGC Europe is proud to be in a continued partnership with the U.S. government and the state of Maryland to provide quality education to 12,000 students annually in 18 countries and 50+ locations in Europe, the Middle East, and North Africa. We are wherever the military is, whether permanently stationed or deployed. Times have changed since those first classes in war-torn buildings 75 years ago. Now we deliver courses both on-site and online using cutting-edge technology, tailored class schedules for individual military units, and innovative live streaming formats at many locations.





More than one million servicemembers have taken UMGC courses. This long relationship has made the university particularly sensitive to the needs of the military community and has prepared UMGC to handle key details, including veterans benefits and the transfer of credit earned in military specialty schools. By proving that high standards of excellence can be maintained in nontraditional settings, UMGC has established itself as an integral part of military life.

Students graduating from UMGC Europe in the Class of 2024 have earned 498 associate degrees, 492 bachelor's degrees, and 128 master's degrees. Graduates represent U.S. military communities across the European, Central, and Africa Commands, with many having served or currently serving in war zones. Worldwide more than 14,000 graduates have earned a UMGC degree over the past year.

Today, UMGC remains committed to the same unifying mission, offering a high-quality education that is affordable and accessible, while meeting critical workforce needs and accommodating the busy lifestyles of adults in the 21st century and the modern U.S. Armed Forces.

We are honored to celebrate 75 years of providing quality education to extraordinary students overseas, including those here today who have achieved an important educational milestone in their lives.


As UMGC graduates, you are each better equipped to lead—in your family, your community, your place of work.

Heart of The University's World-wide Campus

Mr. Beukema Starts As CSCS Chief in Europe

Herman Beukema, retired brigadier general of the United States Army, has taken over as Director of the University of Maryland's College of Special and Continuation Studies Program in Europe.

Mr. Beukema succeeds Dr. Augustus J. Frahl as the university's chief of the European program. Dr. Frahl has returned to the College Park campus as professor in the modern languages department.

Until his retirement last summer, Mr. Beukema served as professor and head of the social sciences department of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. He was a faculty member of the academy for 26 years.

The new chief of the university's CSCS program in Europe is well-equipped for the job. He organized and later headed both the Army Orientation Course and the Army Specialized Training Program.

Mr. Beukema is the author of numerous scientific and literary papers. He is also recognized internationally as an authority on political science and geography.

His new appointment involves coordinating and administering the many educational services and functions of the university's European Program which

encompasses over 100 educational centers in 15 different countries.

U. of Md. CSCS Program Reaches Enrollment Peak

The eighth year of the University of Maryland CSCS educational program, which stretches thousands of miles to virtually all quarters of the globe, begins with a record-shattering 11,500 course enrollments.

A far cry from the 1,800 student registration when the program was established in Europe in 1949, registrations this year are estimated at 9,000 students.

In each of three principal areas of the program, substantial increases in course enrollments have been recorded. In one of these, the North Atlantic Program, enrollments this year have nearly doubled those of last—more than 600, as against the 330 of September, 1953.

Higher by 1,000

The European Program: enrollment figure of 8,400 exceeds by 1,000 the last previous record established in 1951.

The Program in the Washington-Maryland-Virginia area also shows a marked increase, with 4,500 enrollments this year over the 3,952 of 1953.

Administered by the University's College of Special and Continuation Studies, Dr. Ray Ehrenberger, Dean, the Program has been expanded in every area.

Frankfurt Tops in Europe

In Europe, for example, more education centers are in operation than ever before. More languages, a favorite course, are being offered than heretofore. Largest enrollment in the European Program is found at the Frankfurt Education Center, with 300 students. Other top enrollments are in the United Kingdom, with South Ruislip Education Center leading, and in Africa

where the Nousseur Education Center has more than 100 students registered.

Though the North Atlantic Program area is less densely occupied by military bases than Europe, the enthusiasm for learning under University of Maryland guidance is even more remarkable, as reflected by the enrollment figure.

Seven Bases Increase

In all but one of the eight bases where Education Centers have been set up course enrollments jumped substantially. At Harmon Air Force Base enrollments increased to 124 over last year's 46; at Sondrestrom, 50 over 20; at Peperrell, 180 over 92; at Thule, 65 over 21; Iceland, 70 over 33; Goose Bay, 42 over 32; and McAndrew, 40 over 36. There was an enrollment drop at Narssarsuaq to 40 from last year's 48.

Stateside, the biggest center, the Pentagon, increased by nearly 200 students to a current record registration of 1,054. Other big increases were recorded at Bolling, 196 to 272; Meade, 88 to 121; Abscote, 78 to 149; Andrews, 211 to 227; and Walter Reed, 56 to 71.

Dean Ehrenberger sized it up this way:

"Such figures show that Maryland's service to servicemen is becoming even more diverse, more challenging."

Jay Perman was named the fifth chancellor of the University System of Maryland (USM) in January 2020. The USM comprises 12 public universities and three regional higher education centers across the state, enrolling 167,000 students.

Prior to this appointment, Dr. Perman served as president of the University of Maryland, Baltimore—the state’s only public health and human services university—for nearly a decade. A pediatric gastroenterologist, he still practices medicine once a week, teaching team-based health care to students in UMB’s six professional schools.

As chancellor, Dr. Perman is committed to advancing higher education access for all Marylanders. He is building on the USM’s reputation for innovation, particularly in R&D, economic development, and community engagement. Above all, he seeks to fulfill what he sees as his most fundamental obligation: ensuring that every person in Maryland who wants a college education can get one.

Dr. Perman received his Doctor of Medicine degree—with distinction—from Northwestern University. After his residency in pediatrics at Northwestern’s Children’s Memorial Hospital, he completed a fellowship in pediatric gastroenterology at Harvard Medical School and the Children’s Hospital Medical Center in Boston.

In addition to UMB, Dr. Perman has held faculty and leadership positions at UCSF, Johns Hopkins University, Virginia Commonwealth University, and the University of Kentucky, where he served as dean of the College of Medicine.

Linda R. Gooden has chaired the University System of Maryland Board of Regents since 2018, and has served on the board since 2009. She was previously executive vice president of Lockheed Martin Information Systems & Global Services and an officer of the Lockheed Martin Corporation. She was the founding president of Lockheed Martin Information Technology and, over her 40-year career, one of the most respected business leaders in aerospace and defense.

A champion for math, science, and technology education, she served on the Maryland Business Roundtable for Education and on several boards affiliated with Maryland public higher education. She also serves on numerous executive boards including the American Heart Association, General Motors, and Home Depot.

She is among Maryland's—and the nation's—most honored business and civic leaders. She is a member of the Maryland Business Hall of Fame, a 2021 inductee into The Baltimore Sun's Business and Civic Hall of Fame, was recognized by Washingtonian magazine as one of Washington's Most Powerful Women, and was listed among the Top 50 Most Powerful Women in Business for three consecutive years by Fortune magazine. She has been honored as Black Engineer of the Year by U.S. Black Engineer magazine, which has since named its Legacy Award for Ms. Gooden.

Ms. Gooden holds a bachelor's degree in computer technology from Youngstown State University, and a bachelor's in business administration and an MBA from the University of Maryland Global Campus (UMGC).

Gregory W. Fowler, PhD, is president of University of Maryland Global Campus (UMGC), the largest provider of postsecondary education in Maryland and recently designated a minority-serving institution by the U.S. Department of Education. At UMGC, he is leading a transformation that aligns the entire learning journey with the needs and expectations of nontraditional populations and the global workforce, informed by data science and aligned with industry best practices.

Prior to joining UMGC as the university's seventh president in January 2021, Dr. Fowler served as president of Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) Global Campus. He also held senior-level academic and administrative positions at Western Governors University (WGU) and Hesser College in New Hampshire.

Dr. Fowler served as a board member and commissioner of the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE), where he co-chaired the team responsible for the future of postpandemic remote learning experiences for colleges and universities. He currently serves on the Presidents Forum, the Board of Directors of the National Cryptologic Foundation, the Board of Trustees of the Consortium of Universities of the Washington Metropolitan Area, and the UPCEA Council for Chief Online Learning Officers.

A two-time Fulbright Scholar, Dr. Fowler completed his undergraduate studies at Morehouse College. He holds a master's degree in English from George Mason University, an MBA from Western Governors University, and a PhD in English and American Studies from the State University of New York at Buffalo.

In fall 2022, Ms. Patricia “Trish” Coopersmith was promoted to vice president and director of UMGCEurope after serving as deputy director for five years. She is responsible for the division’s headquarters-based departments in Kaiserslautern, Germany, and for a wide variety of policies and processes.

Ms. Coopersmith manages two large military contracts, approximately 500 staff and faculty at 50 locations in 18 countries, and a large operating budget while keeping the Europe division effective and efficient.

She has more than 30 years of business and advisory experience in academic, government, and corporate environments. Before joining UMGCEurope, she served at the Department of Defense (DoD) National Defense University (NDU) in Washington, D.C., as the director of Outreach, International Relations, and Academic Partnerships. There, she was responsible for NDU’s iCollege Academic Partnership Program, growing it from eight university partners—UMGC was the first—to more than 40.

Ms. Coopersmith has worked extensively with the DoD and other federal government agencies, as well as with international defense ministries in Europe and Asia. She also taught as an adjunct professor at NDU and the University of Maryland. Before her tenure at NDU, she served as a business process reengineering management consultant for IBM and PricewaterhouseCoopers and as an industrial engineer for Westinghouse.

She received an MBA from Augusta University and a BS in industrial engineering from Penn State University. Ms. Coopersmith has been married for more than 30 years and has two grown daughters.

STANLEY J. DRAZEK TEACHING EXCELLENCE AWARD

Dr. Stanley J. Drazek (1918–96) joined University of Maryland Global Campus in 1948, one year after its founding. During more than 30 years at UMGC, he served successively as faculty member, director of the Baltimore division, dean, and chancellor.



One of Dr. Drazek's lifelong interests was excellence in teaching. He worked hard to recruit exceptional faculty for UMGC, and he established programs to help teachers reach their full potential in the classroom. Because Dr. Drazek viewed teaching excellence as one of the university's core values, it is fitting that UMGC's Teaching Excellence Award is named in his honor.

Each year, this award is bestowed on faculty members who have been nominated by their students for their distinguished teaching. Two faculty members are being recognized today as this year's UMGC Europe recipients of the Stanley J. Drazek Teaching Excellence Award.

HONORS CANDIDATES

ACADEMIC HONORS for excellence in scholarship are determined from the cumulative grade point averages of undergraduate baccalaureate students who have completed 30 or more credits with University of Maryland Global Campus. Students may earn the distinctions of *cum laude*, *magna cum laude*, and *summa cum laude*, to signify graduation with honor, high honor, and highest honor, respectively. Sometimes called graduation honors, these traditional academic designations are awarded at the time a baccalaureate degree is conferred.

The distinction of *cum laude* honors is conferred on those students with a cumulative grade point average of 3.8 to 3.9, *magna cum laude* is conferred on those students with a grade point average of 3.901 to 3.999, and *summa cum laude* is conferred on those students with a grade point average of 4.0.

Students who have earned these honors wear cords as part of their academic regalia for the commencement ceremony: white cords indicate *cum laude* honors, blue cords indicate *magna cum laude*, and gold cords indicate *summa cum laude*.

ACADEMIC DRESS

THE GOWNS worn by participants in today's procession indicate which academic degrees they hold. At the bachelor's level and above, the gown is usually black, but some universities use colored gowns. At UMGC, doctoral candidates wear red gowns; master's and bachelor's candidates wear black, and associate degree candidates wear the traditional light-gray gown.

The style of sleeve connotes the level of achievement: straight-bottomed sleeves indicate the associate and bachelor's degree; longer, dangling sleeves, the master's degree; and fuller, round sleeves the doctorate.

The gown worn by those who have earned a doctorate is faced with velvet and has three bars of the same material across the sleeves; the facing and bars can be either black, blue, or a color matching the field in which the degree is earned.

Hoods are lined with the colors of the school granting the degree. The velvet border of the hood indicates the discipline. The hood for the doctorate has distinguishing panels and is longer than that for the master's degree. Hoods are not usually worn for the bachelor's or associate degrees at UMGC.

Bachelor's degree recipients who have earned honors for outstanding scholarship wear cords as part of their academic regalia—gold for *summa cum laude*, blue for *magna cum laude*, and white for *cum laude*. These honors are awarded to students at UMGC with a grade point average of 3.800 and higher.

The standard cap is the mortarboard, which is usually the same color as the gown. At UMGC, tassels worn by candidates for degrees below the doctoral level are worn on the right and are moved—with great fanfare—to the left at the end of the ceremony.

The regalia worn by the university president is uniquely designed for each institution. Presidential robes have four bars of velvet across the sleeves, generally piped in a contrasting color, and may have velvet panels down the front. The UMGC president's gown is red with black velvet facing and gold piping to represent the university's colors.

ACADEMIC DEGREES

A DEGREE is awarded for successfully completing a course of study. U.S. colleges and universities now confer more than 1,600 types of academic degrees.

The first degree recorded in history was a doctorate conferred by the University of Bologna in the middle of the twelfth century. Originally, the doctor's and master's degrees were used interchangeably, each indicating that the holder was qualified to give instruction to students. The bachelor's, or baccalaureate, degree indicated only entrance upon a course of study preparatory to a doctorate or mastership. Gradually, however, the bachelor's degree came to signify the successful completion of a level of advanced study preparatory to the higher degrees.

The associate degree originated at the University of Chicago, which began awarding them in 1900. Today's associate degree is typically awarded after two years of study and is often composed of coursework that may be applied toward a bachelor's degree.

In North America, the Bachelor of Arts (BA) was first conferred in 1642, on the nine young men who constituted the first graduating class of Harvard College. Yale conferred its first Bachelor of Arts in 1702; Princeton, in 1748; William and Mary, in 1753; Pennsylvania, in 1757; and Columbia, in 1758.

The Bachelor of Science (BS) was awarded to four graduates of Harvard's class of 1851; they were probably the first from any institution to receive that degree. Women in the United States first received baccalaureate degrees in 1841, when three women graduated from Oberlin College.

The master's degree has passed through various stages since its origin in the Middle Ages. During most of the first two centuries of U.S. collegiate history, the only master's degree awarded was the classic Master of Arts (MA). The University of Michigan offered the first Master of Science (MS) in 1858.

Throughout the nineteenth century, the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree gained status in both Europe and North America. The first earned doctorates in the United States were awarded to three students at Yale in 1861. The Johns Hopkins University was founded for graduate studies in 1876, after which more universities developed doctoral programs in varied disciplines but with requirements similar to the PhD.
