Michael's scholarship explores the paradoxical legacies of postimperial worldmaking. His peerreviewed articles have appeared in *Gender & History*, *Historical Reflections*, *French Politics*, *Culture*, and *Society*, and *The Journal of Urban History*. Michael is completing a manuscript on postwar Parisian suburbia and presented a new project focused on the European Space Port in French Guiana. Recently, Michael received a Holocaust Educational Foundation of Northwestern University grant to develop an undergrad course focused on Natzweiler-Struthof Concentration Camp.

He is a recipient of multiple research and teaching awards including the Stanley J. Drazek Teaching Excellence Award. Michael is dedicated to linking classes with archival, museum, battlefield, and city visits that range from medieval archaeological sites to the former NATO command bunker. He is happiest discussing the past with UMGC Europe students walking through European cities and battlefields from Bastogne to Verdun and beyond.
